

Week 1: Bible Verses from the Gospel of Matthew

The Student in today's class reviewed how to find verses in the Bible. The Lent Project for Ms. Dulce/ Ms. Karen Class will be reading daily scriptures to complete a Jesus Tree. Each day of the week there will be a scripture and the student will color a symbol and glue it on the Jesus Tree. For the next 3 weeks scriptures will be given to you, but after March 20th, parents will be responsible to guide students to the verses. For Week 1: Lent Started on Ash Wednesday- Students have already reviewed the scripture, so just have them color and glue on Jesus Tree. The scriptures that follow are for this week Monday March 2-Saturday March 7.

03-02	4:1-11	<p>Then Jesus was led by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted[a] by the devil. 2 After fasting forty days and forty nights, he was hungry. 3 The tempter came to him and said, “If you are the Son of God, tell these stones to become bread.”</p> <p>4 Jesus answered, “It is written: ‘Man shall not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God.’[b]”</p> <p>5 Then the devil took him to the holy city and had him stand on the highest point of the temple. 6 “If you are the Son of God,” he said, “throw yourself down. For it is written: “He will command his angels concerning you, and they will lift you up in their hands, so that you will not strike your foot against a stone.’[c]”</p> <p>7 Jesus answered him, “It is also written: ‘Do not put the Lord your God to the test.’[d]”</p> <p>8 Again, the devil took him to a very high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms of the world and their splendor. 9 “All this I will give you,” he said, “if you will bow down and worship me.”</p> <p>10 Jesus said to him, “Away from me, Satan! For it is written: ‘Worship the Lord your God, and serve him only.’[e]”</p> <p>11 Then the devil left him, and angels came and attended him.</p>
03-03	4:18-22	<p>18 As Jesus was walking beside the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon called Peter and his brother Andrew. They were casting a net into the lake, for they were fishermen. 19 “Come, follow me,” Jesus said, “and I will send you out to fish for people.” 20 At once they left their nets and followed him.</p> <p>21 Going on from there, he saw two other brothers, James son of Zebedee and his brother John. They were in a boat with their father Zebedee, preparing their nets. Jesus called them, 22 and immediately they left the boat and their father and followed him.</p>
03-04	5:1-12	<p>5 Now when Jesus saw the crowds, he went up on a mountainside and sat down. His disciples came to him, 2 and he began to teach them.</p> <p>The Beatitudes</p>

		<p>He said:</p> <p>3 “Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.</p> <p>4 Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted.</p> <p>5 Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth.</p> <p>6 Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled.</p> <p>7 Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy.</p> <p>8 Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God.</p> <p>9 Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.</p> <p>10 Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.</p> <p>11 “Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of me. 12 Rejoice and be glad, because great is your reward in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you.</p>
03-05	6:5-15	<p>5 “And when you pray, do not be like the hypocrites, for they love to pray standing in the synagogues and on the street corners to be seen by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward in full. 6 But when you pray, go into your room, close the door and pray to your Father, who is unseen. Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you. 7 And when you pray, do not keep on babbling like pagans, for they think they will be heard because of their many words. 8 Do not be like them, for your Father knows what you need before you ask him.</p> <p>9 “This, then, is how you should pray:</p> <p>“Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, 10 your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.</p> <p>11 Give us today our daily bread. 12 And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. 13 And lead us not into temptation,[a] but deliver us from the evil one.[b]</p> <p>14 For if you forgive other people when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. 15 But if you do not forgive others their sins, your Father will not forgive your sins.</p>
03-06	6:25-34	<p>“Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothes? 26 Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? 27 Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life[a]?</p>

		<p>28 “And why do you worry about clothes? See how the flowers of the field grow. They do not labor or spin. 29 Yet I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendor was dressed like one of these. 30 If that is how God clothes the grass of the field, which is here today and tomorrow is thrown into the fire, will he not much more clothe you—you of little faith? 31 So do not worry, saying, ‘What shall we eat?’ or ‘What shall we drink?’ or ‘What shall we wear?’ 32 For the pagans run after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them. 33 But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. 34 Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own.</p>
03-07	8:5-13	<p>When Jesus had entered Capernaum, a centurion came to him, asking for help. 6 “Lord,” he said, “my servant lies at home paralyzed, suffering terribly.”</p> <p>7 Jesus said to him, “Shall I come and heal him?”</p> <p>8 The centurion replied, “Lord, I do not deserve to have you come under my roof. But just say the word, and my servant will be healed. 9 For I myself am a man under authority, with soldiers under me. I tell this one, ‘Go,’ and he goes; and that one, ‘Come,’ and he comes. I say to my servant, ‘Do this,’ and he does it.”</p> <p>10 When Jesus heard this, he was amazed and said to those following him, “Truly I tell you, I have not found anyone in Israel with such great faith. 11 I say to you that many will come from the east and the west, and will take their places at the feast with Abraham, Isaac and Jacob in the kingdom of heaven. 12 But the subjects of the kingdom will be thrown outside, into the darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.”</p> <p>13 Then Jesus said to the centurion, “Go! Let it be done just as you believed it would.” And his servant was healed at that moment.</p>
